ABOUT DELAWARE COUNTY PAY IT FORWARD (DCPIF)

Delaware County Pay It Forward is a community-based 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization serving residents of Delaware County, Iowa. Founded in 2021 following the COVID-19 pandemic, the organization emerged in response to urgent, unmet needs within our rural community. What began as neighbors helping neighbors — delivering masks, groceries, and essential supplies — has grown into a trusted and responsive source of compassionate support for individuals, families, and those who serve our county — focusing on filling the gaps.

Our mission is to model humility, unity, and compassion by sharing hope and inspiring kindness throughout Delaware County.

We provide direct assistance to residents experiencing financial hardship, crisis situations, or unexpected life disruptions. Unlike many formal assistance programs, we operate with minimal barriers and without excessive documentation requirements. If a resident of Delaware County is in need, we step in — quickly, respectfully, and without judgment. This flexible, community-first approach allows us to respond where traditional systems sometimes cannot.

DCPIF is governed by a Board of Directors composed entirely of Delaware County residents and community members. Our board reflects a broad cross-section of professional and community experience. Each board member serves without compensation, reinforcing our commitment to mission-driven leadership and responsible stewardship. This diverse leadership structure ensures balanced decision-making, responsible financial oversight, and a deep understanding of the evolving needs within our county.



LETTER FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

As the Board of Directors for Delaware County Pay It Forward, we are honored to present our 2025 Annual Report and reflect on a year of meaningful impact and growth within our organization.

Delaware County Pay It Forward was founded on a simple principle: neighbors caring for neighbors. In 2025, that principle was demonstrated through the generosity of our community and the dedication of our volunteers. Together, we generated more than \$46,000 to continue our mission to support families across Delaware County.

This year also marked an important period of organizational development. We prioritized strengthening governance practices and financial reporting processes – reflecting our shared commitment to transparency, responsible stewardship, and long-term sustainability. We understand that community trust is earned not only through compassion, but through accountability.

Our signature Christmas Hope Program continued to grow, serving 122 families including 214 children and 51 seniors and people with disabilities in 2025. The Hope Gap Program provided timely assistance to families facing urgent needs. Additionally, we laid the groundwork for the 2026 launch of Hope for Heroes — a structured community investment initiative designed to support those who serve and protect Delaware County.

As we look ahead, our focus remains clear: strengthen financial sustainability, expand collaborative partnerships and continued response to community needs with humility and care.

We are deeply grateful to the donors, volunteers, community partners, and residents who make this work possible. The impact reflected in this report belongs to the entire Delaware County community.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY AND HIGHLIGHTS

2025 was a year of measurable community impact and organizational strengthening for DCPIF.

Through community donations, grants, sponsorships, and fundraising initiatives, DCPIF generated \$46,497.28 in total community-supported revenue. These funds directly supported emergency assistance, holiday giving, and community safety initiatives across Delaware County.

2025 Impact at a Glance

- 122 families served through Christmas Hope
- 214 children received holiday gifts and grocery gift cards
- 51 seniors and disabled persons received gifts and grocery gift cards
- Hope Gap assistance to 28 families
- Family Fun Fest attendance over 350
- Community Garage Sale helped over 200 people prepare for back-to-school
- Over 5,000 volunteer hours contributed across programs and events

2025 marked important organizational progress. The Board of Directors strengthened governance practices and began improving internal reporting to ensure sustainability and transparency.

2025 HIGHLIGHTS

- In January, DCPIF President Missy McIntyre was honored at the Manchester Area Chamber of Commerce Annual Awards Banquet with the Delaware County Meritorious Service Award.
- Delco Together Initiative – DCPIF began participating in a collaborative effort among local organizations, churches, community leaders, and chamber representatives to assess and streamline community resource coordination.
- In August, Michelle Ries, Treasurer, was one of three finalists for Manchester Chamber of Commerce Woman of the Year - 2025 for her positive contributions to the community.
- In 2025, DCPIF launched a more focused and strategic grant development initiative. As our programs continue to grow and community needs evolve, expanding diversified funding sources has become a priority for long-term sustainability.
- In September, we invited community members to our first Informational meet-and-greet event to learn about the organization and volunteer opportunities.
- New website launched September 26 -- www.DelawareCountyPayItForward.org
- Began transitioning former “Back the Blue” efforts into a broader initiative launching in 2026 -- Hope for Heroes supports those who serve and protect Delaware County: law enforcement, firefighters, EMS personnel, educators, healthcare workers, and veterans.
- Began developing the framework to produce DCPIF’s first Annual Report.

As DCPIF continues to grow, our focus remains clear: steward donor funds responsibly, build sustainable funding streams, expand partnerships, and ensure that no Delaware County resident faces hardship alone.

2025 PROGRAM REPORTS

Hope Gap Program - Emergency & Crisis Assistance

The Hope Gap Program provides short-term, gap-filling assistance to individuals and families experiencing urgent needs. Assistance includes:

- Hotel vouchers for domestic abuse victims escaping unsafe situations
- Gas cards and utility assistance for families between paychecks
- Emergency clothing for displaced families
- Support for veterans
- Prescription and healthcare assistance to address unexpected necessities
- Nutrition support and temporary lodging assistance
- Other critical, one-time needs to stabilize a situation

Our goal is simple: prevent small crises from becoming catastrophic ones.

The Hope Gap Program served as a critical emergency support resource in 2024, providing necessary assistance to 84 families experiencing short-term hardship as well as with excess funds honoring our local Veterans, Teachers and First Responders. In 2025, program activity was reduced as the organization evaluated priorities, long-term sustainability, funding strategies and collaboration with county partners to ensure maximum impact in the years ahead. We expect 2026 support to return to 2024 levels or beyond.

CHRISTMAS HOPE PROGRAM

Our largest and most impactful initiative is the Christmas Hope Program, which eases the financial burden of the holiday season for families in need.

Families, disabled persons and seniors in our community apply for assistance, and each child or qualifying family member submits a wish list. We partner with local businesses to display Giving Trees throughout the county. Community members select an ornament representing a child's wish, purchase the gift, and return it unwrapped. Delaware County Pay It Forward supplements unmet needs to ensure dignity and completeness. Volunteers organize and distribute gifts to provide a joyful Christmas morning.

New this year: In 2025, DCPIF coordinated application screening efforts with Operation Santa Claus to eliminate duplicate applications and ensure equitable distribution of community resources.

Also in 2025 the Board made the decision to reduce the number of gifts from six to four per child due to funding constraints.

2025 Impact:

- 122 families served
- 214 children supported (over 1,000 since the program's inception)
- 51 seniors and those with disabilities included (a 46% increase over 2022)
- 31 community partners hosting Giving Trees (more than double 2021)
- \$16,702 distributed in supplemental gifts, essentials, and food cards
- Over 1500 volunteer hours

This program reflects the collective generosity of Delaware County in action.

In 2026 we will continue to collaborate with Operation Santa Claus and partner with Walmart to develop and facilitate their Shop with a Cop program.



HOPE FOR HEROES PROGRAM

In 2025, Delaware County Pay It Forward began building the framework to transition its former “Back the Blue” efforts into a broader initiative launching in 2026: Hope for Heroes.

Hope for Heroes supports the individuals and departments who serve and protect Delaware County — including law enforcement, firefighters, EMS personnel, healthcare workers, and veterans.

The initiative focuses on strengthening community safety and service capacity by investing in needs that may fall outside traditional funding structures. Prior years’ investments totaling more than \$42,000 have included:

- Officer assistance following a line-of-duty shooting
- Funding a new K9 for the Delaware County Sheriff’s Department
- Purchase of speed signs throughout Manchester
- Support for infrared drone and safety equipment

Beginning in 2026, Hope for Heroes will operate as a community investment initiative. Eligible departments and service organizations may submit proposals outlining specific equipment, training, safety, wellness, or operational needs. Proposals will be evaluated based on:

- Demonstrated community impact
- Urgency and necessity of the request
- Long-term benefit to Delaware County residents
- Financial responsibility and sustainability
- Alignment with our mission

Each year, a limited number of projects will be awarded. This structure ensures thoughtful stewardship of funds while strengthening the people and systems that protect and serve Delaware County and our community.

All funded projects will have public reporting requirements.

Hope for Heroes will launch in April 2026, with the first investments awarded in May.

FUNDRAISING

In addition to direct assistance, Delaware County Pay It Forward organizes community events that both raise funds and strengthen local awareness of the organization and our mission.

Family Fun Fest (Formerly Back the Blue)

A summer community carnival featuring a raffle for Fareway Meat Packages, Dolce Vita Limo Night, or \$500 cash, silent auction, games, inflatables, food trucks, dunk-tank, climbing wall, cotton candy machines and face painting, topped off with crowd-favorite pie-in-the-face fundraiser with local leaders and first responders. In addition to being our most productive fundraising event, the festival serves as a powerful visibility and engagement platform — strengthening volunteer participation, expanding community awareness of our mission, and deepening local partnerships. Attendance in 2025 was estimated at 350 and generated net proceeds exceeding \$12,000. 2026 Family Fun Fest is scheduled for August 4.



FUNdraising Concert

An annual community concert featuring regional bands, admission sales, raffles, silent auctions, and food and beverage partnerships. Prior-year events have generated nearly \$6,000 in net proceeds directly supporting our assistance programs. The 2025 concert was rescheduled due to weather and will be held on March 14, 2026 at the Delaware County Fair Grounds Pavillion with entertainers Adam Griffin, Beau Timmerman, and The Boys featuring Lee Klett, and food for purchase by Gentz Curbside Kitchen.

Community Garage Sale

A county-wide, donation-based annual garage sale hosted in the Ryan School gymnasium. With no significant operating expenses, requiring weeks of preparation and more than 1000 volunteer hours, this event generated \$1,985 over the August 15 weekend in 2025. In 2026 our Community Garage Sale will be August 14-15.

GRANTS

In 2025, DCPIF began a more intentional and structured approach to grant research and application development. As our programs continue to grow, the need for diversified funding sources has become increasingly clear.

During the year, multiple grant opportunities were identified and applications were submitted at the local, county, state, and national levels. While most submissions remain pending at the time of this report, this expanded focus represents an important step toward long-term sustainability and increased community impact.

Building this grant pipeline required research, relationship development, and internal process refinement. The groundwork established in 2025 positions DCPIF to pursue larger and more strategic funding opportunities in the years ahead. This groundwork will enable us to increase program capacity, respond more effectively to emerging needs, and extend our impact across Delaware County.

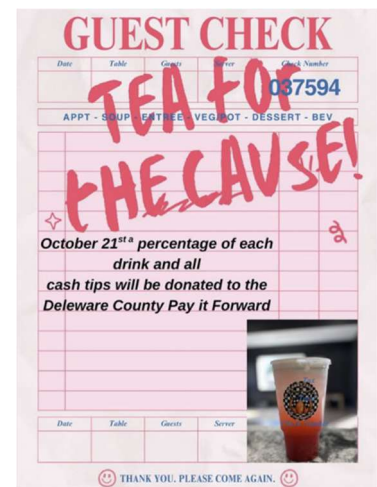
